Ireland agrees in principle to create new single-permit system for third-country nationals

Executive summary

On 15 December 2022, the Irish government agreed in principle to introduce a streamlined, single-permit system for thirdcountry nationals who seek to work and reside in Ireland. An Inter Departmental Working Group (IDWG) will be established with the goal of evaluating the feasibility of implementing the new system.

Background

In December 2011, the European Parliament and the Council of the European Union (EU) issued Directive 2011/98/EU (the <u>Single Permit Directive</u>) with the objective of introducing single permits for third-country nationals (i.e., nationals of countries outside the EU and EEA) who seek to work and reside in EU Member States. In April 2022, the European Commission issued a proposed <u>Directive</u> to provide further clarification regarding the single application procedure.

Currently, third-country nationals who seek to work and reside in Ireland must apply separately for work authorization from the Irish Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment and residence authorization from the Department of Justice. Those who require visas to enter Ireland based on their nationality (i.e., visa nationals) must also obtain entry visas prior to travel.

Key developments

If the new streamlined system is implemented, eligible thirdcountry nationals will be able to file a single application to obtain Irish work and residence authorization. If the application is approved, they will be issued one authorization document instead of two. Further details are awaited regarding whether visa nationals would be required to apply for entry visas separately. The IDWG is expected to deliver an opinion within six months on whether, and how, to implement the new system.

Impact on employers

The new single-permit system, if adopted, would provide Irish employers with greater access to global talent to meet local labor market needs. It would also attract further investments and simplify the immigration application process for eligible third-country nationals.
