Mexico's President submits comprehensive economic proposal to Congress

Mexico's President has submitted to Congress the first economic proposal of his presidency for 2020. The proposal includes changes aimed at strengthening compliance with the existing tax structure and challenging base erosion and profit shifting. Before becoming law, the proposal must be debated and passed by the two legislative bodies in Mexico. Taxpayers and investors should monitor the proposal's progress through the legislative process and be prepared to meet additional compliance obligations and challenges on cross-border transactions.

US-China trade: China publishes first punitive tariff exclusions while US postpones 5% increase to Lists 1, 2 and 3

On 11 September, China's Customs Tariff Commission announced a list of 16 tariff items that will be exempted from the retaliatory tariffs on the US\$500 billion of US origin goods (China Lists 1 and 2). These are the first group of exemptions to be granted by the Commission since the punitive tariffs went into effect in July and August 2018. On the same day, following the announcements out of China, US President Donald Trump announced that the US would delay a scheduled 5% increase to the 25% punitive tariffs on \$250b of Chinese origin goods (Lists 1, 2 and 3).

Ecuador issues new regulations on applying for authorized economic operator status

The Ecuadorian Customs Authority has issued new regulations on the procedure for applying for authorized economic operator (AEO) status. AEO status has many benefits, including reduced inspections and reviews of import documentation.

Costa Rica signs new free trade agreements with Korea and UK

Costa Rica approved the free trade agreement (FTA) between Central America and Korea, effective 4 September 2019. The Korean FTA will allow 80% of Costa Rica's products to enter the Korean market tariff free and could attract more foreign direct investment in Costa Rica. In addition, Central America and the UK have signed an Association Agreement guaranteeing continuity in their commercial relationship.

Canada enhances trade remedy system by amending Special Import Measures Regulations

Canada has published regulations amending the "Special Import Measures Regulations" to provide the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) with additional methods for calculating appropriate dumping margins in its anti-dumping investigations. The amendments are expected to give the CBSA more flexibility in determining production costs in transactions between associated parties and in particular market situations.

Canada to remit surtaxes collected on certain imports of heavy steel plate and stainless-steel wire

Effective 23 August 2019, Canada's "Surtax on the Importation of Certain Steel Goods Remission Order" relieves surtax paid since October 2018 on seven types of imported heavy steel plate and one type of imported stainless steel wire. Certain conditions and requirements apply.

Canada implements new permit and reporting requirements for aluminum and steel imports

Canada has implemented new reporting requirements for imports of carbon steel, specialty steel products, and aluminum products. The changes are aimed at improving Canada's steel and aluminum import regime and meeting its commitments under the Joint Statement by Canada and the United States on Section 232 Duties on Steel and Aluminum.

OECD releases 2018 mutual agreement procedure statistics

The OECD has released its annual publication on Mutual Agreement Procedure (MAP) statistics. For 2018, the report includes statistics from all OECD members and most of the members of the OECD Inclusive Framework on BEPS – a total of 89 jurisdictions and almost all MAP cases worldwide. The number of new MAP cases continues to increase, with a 14.9% growth rate in 2018.
