### Latest news - Americas

#### Colombian Constitutional Court declares 2018 tax reform unconstitutional

On 16 October 2019, the Colombian Constitutional Court declared the 2018 tax reform unconstitutional because of procedural flaws in Congress's approval process. However, the Court decided that the tax reform will remain in effect until the end of 2019, giving Congress time to approve a new tax law that affirms the 2018 tax reform or introduce new measures that would amend the Colombian tax laws. If no action is taken, the tax regime in force before the 2018 tax reform will apply beginning 1 January 2020.

#### Paraguay enacts tax reform

Paraguay has enacted new tax reform legislation that establishes transfer pricing rules, which were not previously part of Paraguay's tax law. The tax reform also creates a new income tax and includes corporate income carryforward rules. The Executive Power must still issue a regulatory decree with the law's effective date, but it is likely that the effective date will be 1 January 2020.

#### US and China reach initial accord towards trade agreement

On 11 October, the US President and Chinese Vice Premier announced that the two nations had reached an initial trade accord, referred to as the Phase One agreement. Phase One features increased US agricultural purchases by China, suspended punitive tariff increases by the US, certain Chinese concessions on currency manipulation, as well as the framework for next steps on other issues. The US has indicated that Phase One is the first step towards a more comprehensive trade agreement.

# MERCOSUR decision allows goods to retain origin quality when passing through a free trade zone

A MERCOSUR decision has entered into force that allows goods made with materials from MERCOSUR countries (Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay, and Uruguay) to retain their MERCOSUR origin quality when passing through a free trade zone (FTZ), provided the goods enter the FTZ for transportation or warehousing. Accordingly, such goods may remain eligible for preferential tax treatment. Prior to the decision, goods entering a FTZ lost their MERCOSUR origin and could not benefit from preferential tax treatment.

# Mexican President's comprehensive economic proposal – EY article reviews key aspects
